Library Media

- a) Continue to implement the five-year collection development plan that systematically maintains district library collections to meet MSIP and the Standards for Missouri Library Media Centers.
Status: Met/On-going

The library and audio-visual collections are designed to support CSIP Goal 1 by providing high quality, high interest materials for students and teachers to use in school and at home. Table 1B provides the total annual circulation and circulation by student population for each school. Circulation by student population increased or remained stable in 9 of 10 schools. **Overall, circulation increased for the tenth consecutive year** as noted in Table 1A.

All schools in the district meet the most rigorous of the *Standards for Missouri Library Media Centers (DESE, 2005)*. Materials of recent publication continue to be added to the library collections as vigilance and funding are the keys to maintaining a collection of the highest quality. Library Media Specialists continue to weed their collections and seek materials that target the weakest areas in our library collections. **Collections presently meet and exceed the 3rd Cycle MSIP standards.**

- b) Review schedules at every school using 3rd cycle MSIP standards to ensure compliance regarding the availability and access of the Library Media Centers throughout the school day, before and after school, and throughout the school year.

Status: Met/On-going

Each Library Media Center (LMC) is readily available and accessible to all student populations and staff throughout the school day, before and after school, and throughout the school year. A flexible LMC schedule is in effect at all levels. The high school library remained open each evening Monday

through Thursday on days school was in session. Evening hours were available beginning in January 2003. **For the months available for comparison, there was a favorable increase in the number of students using the library between 3:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.**

- c) Continue to articulate and evaluate the integration of information literacy within instruction and revised curriculum.
Status: Met/On-going

Library Media Specialists have integrated information literacy instruction using Grade-level Expectations as a foundation. The Grade-level Expectations with Integrated Library Media connections is currently in draft form and will be finalized this school year. Further, Library Media Specialists report active participation by teachers and students in projects identified in the guide. Information Literacy now appears as part of the Grade Level Expectations in Communication Arts and Social Studies.

- d) Continue to record and evaluate participation in the summer library program within the district and St. Louis County Library.
Status: Met/On-going

Summer library program participation is noted for the first time in Table 1C in two categories: summer school library circulation and participation by area children in the St. Louis County Library Summer Program. **Initial observations are positive about summer school circulation and the county library reports a county-wide increase in participation in the summer reading program over the previous year.**
